PROJECTS AND RESEARCH

COMPLEXITIES OF COMPLIMENTS, 2022 (RESEARCH)

I designed and executed an original research project on the impact of effort-based compliments on fostering growth mindsets in 8th-grade math students with my literature review incorporating key theories by Carol Dweck and Robin Alexander. I developed and implemented observational protocols, qualitative field notes, and student surveys, then analyzed classroom interactions and survey data to assess the correlation between effort-based praise and mindset development. Finally, I presented the findings in my research paper.

EFFECTS OF RACIALLY AND CULTURALLY REPRESENTATIVE BOOKS (RESEARCH)

I conducted an 18-month senior thesis that asked the question, how does fostering critical literacy using racially representative books boost critical consciousness and literacy skills? I spent 60 hours doing classroom observations in a local 6th grade, conducting interviews and field notes. Using Paulo Freire's theories from the Pedagogy of the Oppressed I ran a focus group where we discussed the nuance of race, the dominance of white culture, and many other topics while I assessed their literacy skills. This led me to a deeper understanding of how students are making sense of the world when presented with racially representative books.
